## Frequently Asked Questions

Below we will try and answer your most frequently asked questions. If the answer is not below please contact the race director and he will contact you as soon as possible.

**Q: *Where do I collect my race number and timing chip?***

A: These will be issued on the day from 8:00AM at Race HQ, Tavistock College.

**Q: *Why do you not send them out earlier?***

A: Two Reasons 1) The timing chips are expensive - £12.00 each. Many competitors fail to return the chips if they are unable to run on the day & we would end up having to pay for any missing chips!!  
2) It also helps to know who turns up and if the actual runner matches the pre programmed chip info.

**Q: *How do I know my entry has been received?***

**Q: *Can I enter on the day?***

A: Strictly speaking - No! However, in the past we have taken the decision that runners can run - but we cannot guarantee them a chip timing or T-shirt if we are unable to preload the info prior to the start. The entry fee still applies.

**Q: *Where can I park?***

A: We will have limited parking at the school for approximately 500 cars. Once these places have been taken, parking facilities will be at the Tavistock football ground, Crowndale Road, and also the Town car parks. Please see website for further details.

**Q: *When I park at the school, why is it not possible to leave before 12.30?***

A: Safety grounds - we want to avoid the possibility of cars interfering with runners which will still be entering the school.

**Q: *What time is the race?***

A: 10:00 am prompt start for the main race, followed by the Primary Challenge and then the Fun Run.

**Q: *Is the route all on Road?***

A: No - approximately 2 miles is on a cycle track following the old railway line. This is still tarmac and easy flat running. The remainder is on predominately quiet country roads which have been closed to traffic.

**Q: *How long do I have to complete the half marathon?***

A: 3 hours. After that time the closed roads are open to through traffic and we cannot guarantee the timing facilities will still be insitu.

**Q: *Where can I find the results?***

A: Provisional race day results will be on the Tavy13 website or FullOn Sport as soon as possible - but probably on the Monday.
